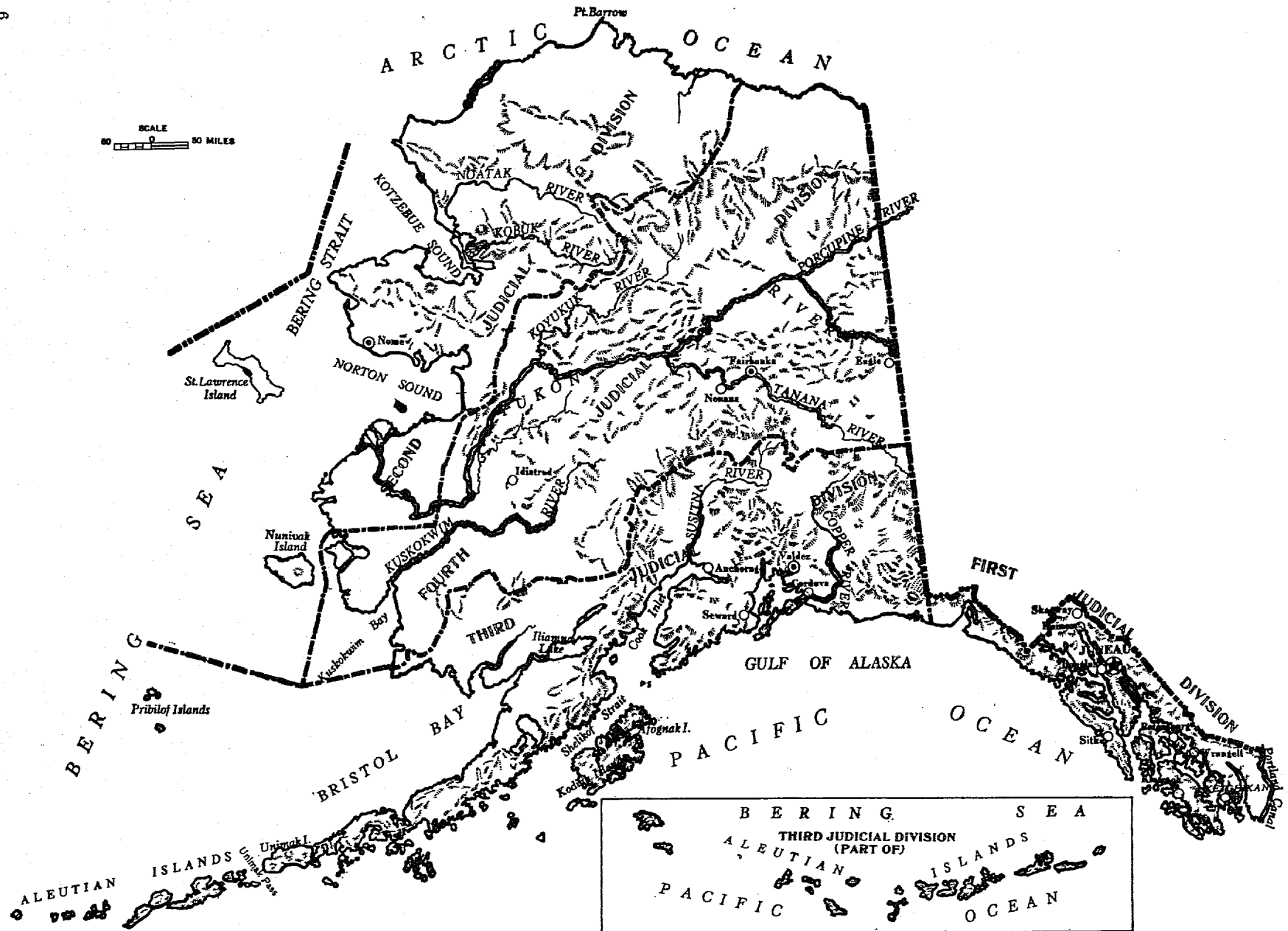

NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF INHABITANTS

Population of the Territory.—Alaska was purchased by the United States from the Russian Government in March, 1867. The first enumeration of its population by the United States was made in 1880 and consisted of a canvass of all accessible settlements, supplemented by estimates based mainly upon records and personal knowledge of missionary priests, for those regions which could not be visited. A similar practice was followed in 1890, but the area actually canvassed in that year was larger than that visited in 1880, and at each subsequent census the enumerations have been more nearly complete and accurate. After a careful consideration of the unusual climatic conditions, the wide dispersion of small population over large areas, and the inaccessibility of certain regions, October 1, 1929, was decided upon as the date of the enumeration

of Alaska instead of April 1, 1930, the official date of enumeration of the Fifteenth Census. Authority for this change for commencing the enumeration in Alaska to a date prior to April 1, 1930, is contained in section 6 of the act of Congress providing for the Fifteenth Census, approved June 18, 1929. The population of Alaska on October 1, 1929, according to the Fifteenth Census, was 59,278, which represents an increase of 4,242, or 7.7 per cent, as compared with the population on January 1, 1920. The gross area of Alaska, land and water, is 586,400 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1930 is one-tenth of 1, or practically the same as in 1920.

Table 1 shows the population of Alaska from 1880, the year in which its area was first enumerated, to 1930, together with the increase during each census period.

Judicial divisions, towns, villages, and minor civil divisions.—In the tables which follow (Tables 2 to 4), the population of Alaska is shown by judicial divisions, recording districts, incorporated towns, unincorporated towns and villages, and the United States Army post, with some comparative figures from previous censuses.

Judicial divisions.—Alaska has no county organization, but in 1909, for court purposes, the Territory was

divided into four "judicial divisions," which are treated for census purposes as equivalent to county areas.

Table 2 shows the population of these four judicial divisions from 1910 to 1930, together with the increase or decrease in each decade. Changes in boundaries since 1920 are indicated by footnotes at the end of Table 2; for changes between 1910 and 1920 reference may be made to the Reports of the Fourteenth Census (1920), Volume I, Table 54.

POPULATION—ALASKA

Minor civil divisions.—Table 3 shows the population of each judicial division by recording districts, towns, and villages. Following the precedent of previous censuses of Alaska, the larger and more important unincorporated towns and villages, and the United States Army Post (Chilkoot Barracks) have been returned separately and are shown, together with the incorporated towns, under the recording districts in which each respective place is located. The abbreviation "(Inc.)" is placed after each incorporated town. Those unincorporated villages for which no

population is given for 1920 and 1910 have not previously been reported.

The Second, Third, and Fourth Judicial Divisions were redistricted between 1910 and 1920; in these divisions for 1910, therefore, no figures are shown in Table 3 for the recording districts.

Changes in the boundaries of recording districts between 1920 and 1930 are indicated by footnotes on Table 3; for changes between 1910 and 1920 reference may be made to the Reports of the Fourteenth Census (1920), Volume I, Table 54.

¹ FIRST JUDICIAL DIVISION.—Hyder district organized from part of Kotlikan district, and part of Sitka district annexed to Juneau district, since 1920. Petersburg district formed from part of Wrangell district between 1910 and 1920. The name of Chilkoot Barracks changed from Wm. H. Seward since 1920. Klawook village incorporated as a town in 1920. Metlakatla town returned as incorporated in 1920.

² SECOND JUDICIAL DIVISION.—Judicial division total for 1920 includes population (658) of Barrow district and population (339) of Point Hope district, annexed to Neotak-Kobuk district; population (353) of Council City district, part taken to form part of Koyuk district, and parts annexed to Cape Nome and Fairhaven districts; population (165) of Kougarok, and population (304) of St. Lawrence Island districts, annexed to Cape Nome district, since 1920. Other changes since 1920: Koyuk district formed from parts of old Council City and Fairhaven districts; part of Wade Hampton district annexed to Cape Nome district and part annexed to Fourth Judicial Division. Kotlik village returned as in St. Michael district, and Russian Mission village returned as in the Fourth Judicial Division, in 1920.

Judicial division total for 1920 includes population (279) of Holy Cross district annexed to Nulato district; population (145) of Ophir district, taken to form part of Innoko district; population (402) of Shageluk district, annexed to Otter district; population (163) of Tanana district, annexed to Fairbanks district; population (90) of Wade Hampton district, taken to form part of Bethel district since 1920. Other changes since 1920: Part of Fortymile district annexed to Fairbanks district; parts of Mount McKinley and Nulato districts taken to form part of Innoko district. Akiak village and Pymute village returned as in Kuskokwim district in 1920. Nonana village incorporated as a town since 1920. Tanana town returned as incorporated in 1920.

Towns and villages.—Table 4 shows the population of the incorporated towns, unincorporated towns and villages, and United States Army Post in Alaska in 1930 and 1920. In this table, the places are arranged

in alphabetical order, each followed by the number of the judicial division and the name of the recording district in which the place is located. Incorporated places are distinguished by the abbreviation "Inc."

COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

Introduction.—In this section the population of the Territory of Alaska is classified by sex, color, nativity, age, marital condition, year of immigration, dwellings and families, and place of birth. Also, items are shown relative to ability to speak English, illiteracy and school attendance, and occupations by industrial groups. These statistics are given in more or less detail for all the political divisions or areas shown in

the preceding tables except for towns or villages having less than 1,000 inhabitants. In the more important tables separate statistics are presented for the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan.

Table 1 shows the population of the Territory of Alaska in 1930 by judicial divisions, with separate figures for the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan, and with comparative figures for earlier censuses.

Color, nativity, and sex.—Because of the wide differences in characteristics among the various classes of the population, the statistics on most subjects are shown according to color or race. The term "white" as here used refers to pure-blooded white persons. The term "Indian" refers to both full-blooded Indians and Indians of mixed Indian and other blood.

In Table 2 are presented the population statistics for the Territory for the last three censuses, with classification by color and sex for the entire population and by nativity and parentage for the white population. The white population is thus divided primarily into three groups: (1) Natives of native parentage—that is, having both parents born in continental United States or in Alaska or other United States Territory or possession; (2) natives of foreign or mixed parentage—that is, having one or both parents born abroad; and (3) foreign born. In Table 2, and also in the table for judicial divisions and Juneau and Ketchikan, the second group is divided into two parts, namely, (a) natives of foreign parentage—that is, having both parents born abroad, and (b) natives of mixed parentage—that is, having one parent native and the other foreign born. The population statistics for each color or race classified according to nativity

and parentage are given in Table 3. Statistics of the population classified by color, nativity, and sex are presented for judicial divisions and for the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan in Table 19, and for recording districts and incorporated places of 1,000 to 2,500 in Tables 23 and 24.

Citizenship.—The foreign-born white population is distributed in Table 2 by citizenship. This classification comprises four groups: (1) Naturalized; (2) having first papers—that is, having made formal declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States; (3) alien; (4) unknown—that is, with status as to citizenship not reported. Citizenship is also shown for foreign-born white persons 21 years of age and over in Table 5.

Age.—The age classification in the census returns is based on age at last birthday, that is, age in completed years. The age statistics are presented for the Territory in Table 4, for judicial divisions in Table 17, and for the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan in Table 18. In these tables the age classification is presented not only for the total population but also for the more important population classes (native white, foreign-born white, Indian, etc.), by sex. Table 4 shows the distribution of the population by specified age periods,

and by single years of age for persons under 25. The age classification of the total population also is given in Table 23 for recording districts and in Table 24 for incorporated places of 1,000 to 2,500 population.

Table 5 shows the population 21 years of age and over classified by color, nativity, and sex, for 1930 and 1920, with data for the foreign-born white by citizenship and also for males of militia age (18 to 44 years).

School attendance.—The school-attendance tabulation is based on the replies to the enumerator's inquiry as to whether the person had attended school or college of any kind since September 1, 1929. The totals for the Territory are presented in Table 6 for the principal population groups separated into significant age periods. School attendance is shown by judicial divisions and for the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan in Table 19.

Illiteracy.—The census defines as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to read and write. The classification is based on the answers given to the enumerator in response to the question "Whether able to read and write." No specific test of ability to read and write was prescribed, but the enumerators were instructed not to return the answer "Yes" (which would classify the person as literate) simply because a person was able to write his or her name. The statistics of illiteracy are presented for the Territory in Tables 7 and 8, and for the judicial divisions and the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan in Table 19.

Inability to speak English.—Table 9 shows, by color, sex, and nativity, for 1930 and 1920, the number of persons 10 years of age and over who were reported as unable to speak the English language.

Marital condition.—The classification as to marital condition—whether single, married, widowed, or divorced—is presented for the population 15 years of age and over by sex, color, and nativity in Table 10 for the Territory as a whole, and by sex only in Table 19 for judicial divisions and the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan. In Table 11 statistics of the marital condition of the entire population of the Territory are presented by sex, color, and nativity, separated into significant age periods.

Indian stock.—An attempt was made at the Fifteenth Census to classify the Indians of Alaska according to the tribes forming the various linguistic stocks. However, the answers to the inquiry concerning tribe were so incomplete that the data have been omitted in this publication. Table 12 shows the Indian population of Alaska classified by linguistic stock, as reported at the last three censuses. In Table 13 the 1930 statistics for the Alaskan Indians are presented not only by stock but also by sex, age, and purity of blood.

Foreign white stock by country of origin.—The foreign white stock, as defined by the Census Bureau, is composed of two distinct elements, the foreign-

born white and the native white of foreign or mixed parentage. The foreign-born white are classified according to country of birth; the native white of foreign or mixed parentage are classified according to country of birth of father, except where the father is native and the mother foreign born, and then according to country of birth of mother. All classifications of the 1930 population according to country of birth, so far as they relate to European stock, are based on the present political boundaries of European countries. Comparative figures are presented for the foreign born only, because the 1920 figures for natives of foreign parentage were classified according to pre-war rather than postwar geography, with the result that for many countries the data are not comparable with those tabulated for 1930. In addition to the summary for the Territory presented in Table 14, statistics for the foreign-born white by country of birth are presented for judicial divisions and for the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan in Table 21, and statistics for the native white of foreign or mixed parentage by country of birth of parents are presented in Table 22 for the same areas.

Year of immigration.—In the distribution of the foreign-born population by year of immigration the calendar year is the basis of the classification, and the date given is the year of immigration to the United States or to any of its Territories or possessions, not necessarily the year of arrival in Alaska. In Table 15 are presented statistics of the foreign-born population of Alaska by race and year of immigration.

Place of birth of native population.—The term "native population" as ordinarily used by the Census Bureau comprises all persons born in continental United States or any of its Territories or possessions, persons born at sea under the United States flag, and persons of native parentage born abroad and designated as "American citizens born abroad." The place of birth of the native population is shown in Table 16.

Dwellings and families.—A dwelling, for census purposes, is a structure in which one or more persons regularly sleep. It need not be a house in the usual sense of the word. A boat, a tent, a freight car, or a room in a factory, store, or office building, although occupied by only one person, is also counted as a dwelling. On the other hand, an apartment house, although containing many families, constitutes but one dwelling. The term "family" as used in the census signifies a group of persons, whether related by blood or not, who live together as one household, usually sharing the same table. Also, one person living alone is counted a family. On the other hand, all the occupants and employees of a hotel, boarding house, or lodging house, if that is their usual place of abode, and all the inmates of an institution, however numerous, are treated as constituting a single family. Thus the census family in some cases differs greatly

from the natural family. In Table 25 are presented for the Territory as a whole and for judicial divisions and the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan statistics relating to dwellings and families for 1930 and 1920.

Gainful workers by industry groups.—Table 26 shows the population 10 years of age and over engaged in gainful occupations classified into about 50 industrial groups. (Persons usually working at a gainful occupation but temporarily unemployed at the time of the census are included in the number of gainful workers.) Specific occupations in the agricultural group (farmers, farm laborers, etc.) are shown separately. The other classifications are strictly industry or service groups, with no attempt to show specific

occupations. The figures are presented for male and female workers. Similar figures, though with a somewhat condensed list of industry groups, are presented by judicial divisions and for the towns of Juneau and Ketchikan in Table 27. Table 26 shows the complete list of industry groups as tabulated, without regard to their importance in Alaska. Small numbers of workers may be shown in this table for industries not carried on in Alaska, these representing persons who usually work in the specified industries elsewhere. In Table 27 the smaller groups have been consolidated and only the more important ones are shown. The specific make-up of any of these consolidated groups can be found by referring to Table 26.

AGRICULTURE—ALASKA

NUMBER OF FARMS, ACREAGE, TENURE, VALUE, PRODUCTION, AND LIVESTOCK

Introduction.—About 65,000 square miles of land in Alaska are suitable for agriculture. A large part of this land is located in the Matanuska Valley in South Central Alaska and in the Tanana Valley farther north. Areas in southeastern Alaska, southwestern Alaska, and on the Alaska and Kenai Peninsulas are also suitable for farming. The arctic region, however, is unfavorable to crop production except in a few isolated places where hardy vegetables grow well on southern slopes. Vast tracts of land, still under Government ownership, are available to homesteaders.

Census dates.—The census of 1930 relates to October 1, 1929, and covers the farming operations for the 12 months ending on that date. The censuses of 1920 and 1910 relate to January 1 of those years and the crop years 1919 and 1909, respectively.

Farm.—A "farm," for census purposes, is all the land which is directly farmed by one person, either by his own labor alone or with the assistance of members of his household or hired employees. The land operated by a partnership is likewise considered a farm. A "farm" may consist of a single tract of land, or of a number of separate tracts, and these several tracts may be held under different tenures, as when one tract is owned by the farmer and another tract is rented by him. When a landowner has one or more tenants, renters, or managers, the land operated by each is considered a farm. Thus on a plantation the land operated by each tenant was reported as a separate farm, and the land operated by the owner or manager by means of wage hands likewise was reported as a separate farm.

The enumerators were instructed not to report as a farm any tract of land of less than 3 acres, unless its agricultural products in 1929 were valued at \$250 or more.

Farm operator.—A "farm operator," according to the census definition, is a person who operates a farm, either performing the labor himself or directly supervising it.

Color of farm operators.—Farm operators are classified as white and colored, the colored including Indians and Japanese.

Tenure.—Farm operators are classified, according to the tenure under which they operate their farms, into three general classes, as follows:

Owners are farm operators who own all or part of the land which they operate.

Managers are farm operators who operate farms or ranches for the owners, receiving wages or salaries for their services.

Tenants are farm operators who operate hired land only.

Land in farms.—The acreage designated as "All land in farms" includes considerable areas of land not actually under cultivation and some not even used for pasture, since each farmer was asked to report as a unit all the land under his control, or rather all the land which he thought of as a part of his farm. Isolated tracts of timberland and other areas not connected with the farm were not included. The following classes of farm land are shown separately:

1. **Improved land.**—Under this heading are reported all land regularly tilled or mowed; land in pastures that has been cleared or tilled; land lying fallow; land in gardens and orchards; and land occupied by buildings, yards, and barnyards.

2. **Woodland.**—Under this heading are reported all farm woodlots, natural or planted, and cut-over land with young growth.

3. **Unimproved land.**—Under this heading is reported all land not improved or in woodland.

Farm values.—The farmer was asked to report, first, the total value of his farm (land and buildings), including all the land which he operated, both owned and hired, whether operated for himself or managed for others. He was asked to give the current market value—that is, the amount for which the farm would sell under normal conditions, not at forced sale. The tabulated results of this inquiry are shown as value of "Land and buildings" and represent the total value of farm real estate.

The farmer was also asked to report the value of all farm buildings on his farm. These values were necessarily estimated, and the figures obtained are probably somewhat less satisfactory than the figures for the total real-estate value.

In comparing the values of farm properties as reported at the census of 1930 with those reported in 1920, the variations in the purchasing power of the dollar should be kept in mind.

The value of farm implements and machinery is the combined value of automobiles, trucks, tractors, tools, wagons, harnesses, dairy equipment, and all other farm machinery. The value of commercial mills and factories located on the farm was not included.

Farm expenditures comprise amounts expended by farm operators during the 12 months ended October 1, 1929, for selected items defined on the schedule, as follows:

Feed includes hay, grain, mill feed, and other products ("not raised on this farm") for use as feed for domestic animals and poultry.

Farm labor, amount expended in cash for farm labor (exclusive of housework).

Livestock.—In this section statistics are presented for 10 classes of livestock, namely, horses, mules, cattle, sheep, goats, swine, poultry, dogs used for work

animals, reindeer, and fur-bearing animals in captivity. With the exception of reindeer, statistics for livestock on farms and livestock not on farms are shown separately. Cattle on farms are divided into three classes—calves under 1 year old; cows kept mainly for milk; and all other cattle.

Reindeer.—The statistics for reindeer are presented in a separate table. The figures given for 1910 and 1920 are as reported at the censuses for those years, but the figures for 1930 are estimates based on information secured from the Reindeer Experiment Station, of the Bureau of Biological Survey, United States Department of Agriculture, located at College, Alaska. Because of the increasing importance of the reindeer industry in Alaska, every effort was made at the census of 1930 to secure an accurate enumeration of the reindeer; however, the returns were so incomplete that it was decided that a reliable estimate such as that given would more nearly represent the actual number of reindeer in the Territory.

Livestock products.—In this section statistics are presented showing the number of cows milked, and the milk

produced and sold; cream sold; butter made and sold; number of sheep and lambs shorn, and wool shorn; and all eggs produced, and eggs and poultry sold.

Acreage and production of crops.—The acreage and production for all crops secured in the census of 1930 relate to the 12 months ended October 1, 1929. The acreage shown for the several crops represents the acreage harvested, which is sometimes less than the acreage planted. The production represents the quantity harvested in the form indicated.

The acreage of vegetables harvested for sale is shown, also the quantity of potatoes sold, and the value of vegetables grown for home use as well as the value of all vegetables sold.

In one of the tables an item is given which represents the receipts from sales of vegetables, plants, and flowers grown in greenhouses and hothouses.

Fruits.—Data with regard to orchard fruits and small fruits are presented. The number of orchard trees and their production are shown, together with the acreage and production of small fruits, and the value of all orchard fruits and berries sold.
